Autumn Fungi ID



Amethyst deceiver
 This purple fungus grows in leaf litter, especially under beech trees.



Destroying angel
 These pure white mushrooms are extremely poisonous, so look but don't touch!



Shaggy parasol
 This species of mushroom grows in fairy rings, so look out for them.



Blusher
 When this fungus is bruised, the white flesh inside 'blushes' pink.



Honey fungus
 This toadstool is parasitic – it attacks and kills tree and plant roots – and it glows in the dark!

Wow!

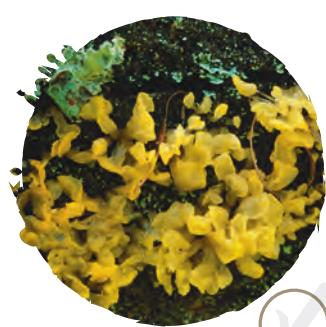


Common eyelash
 Look out for a fringe of eyelashes around the edge of this tiny fungus.



Dead man's fingers
 This fungus looks like rotting fingers poking up out of the ground!

Creepy!



Lemon disco
 Spot groups of tiny, bright yellow discs on decaying tree stumps and trunks

 Some fungi can be very poisonous, so never touch them.
