## You will need:

- A tree
- A piece of paper
- Pencils, crayons or charcoal

# Bark artist



- 1** Find a tree.  
One with gnarly,  
interesting bark is best.



- 2** Press the paper against the bark and hold it in place.



- 3** Rub your charcoal, pencil or crayon against the paper. You'll need to press firmly.



- 4** When the pattern has come through, you can move the paper.

**Ta-da!**  
You're a brilliant bark artist!

Try layering colours and patterns, or create lots of bark rubbings from different trees.
