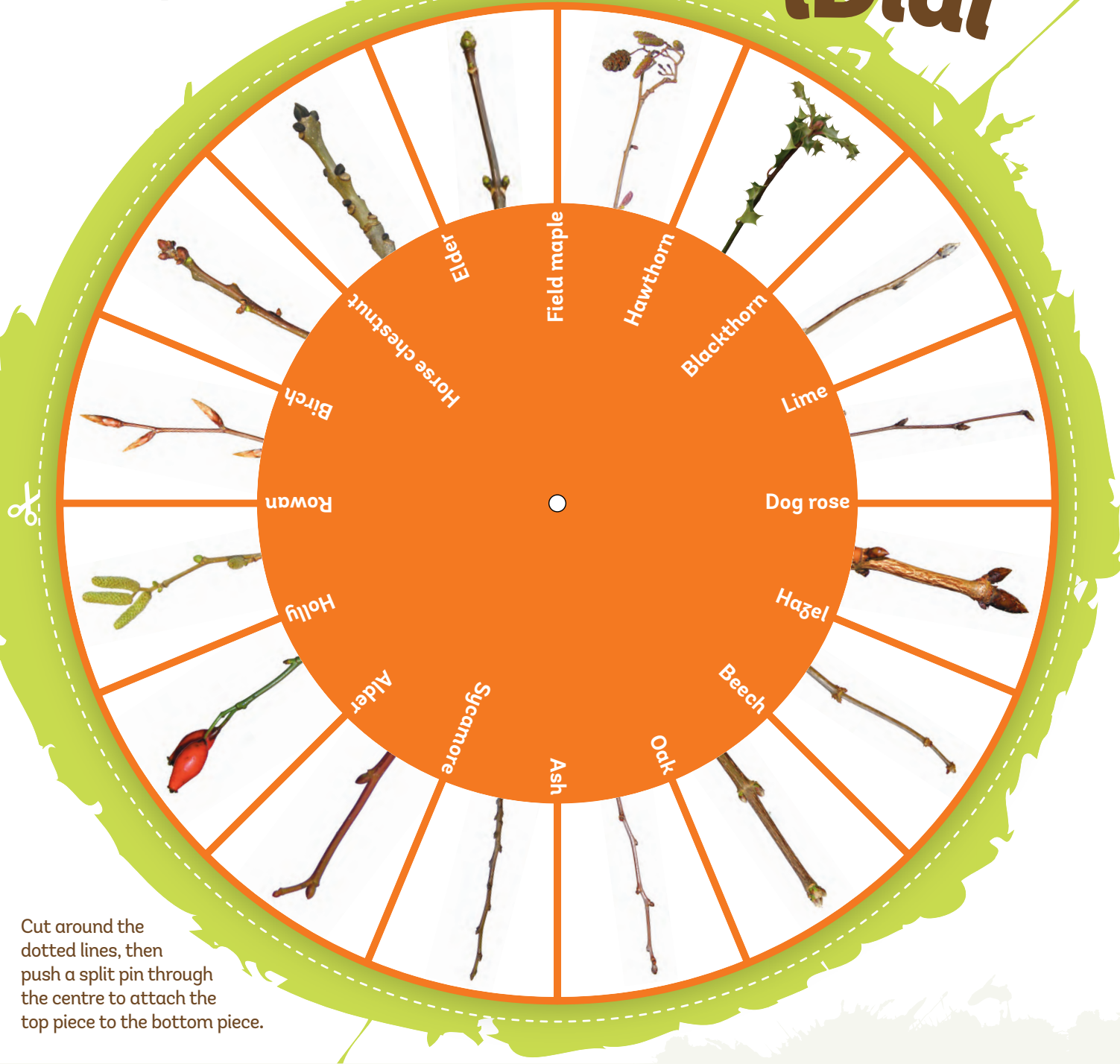

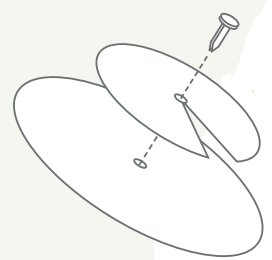
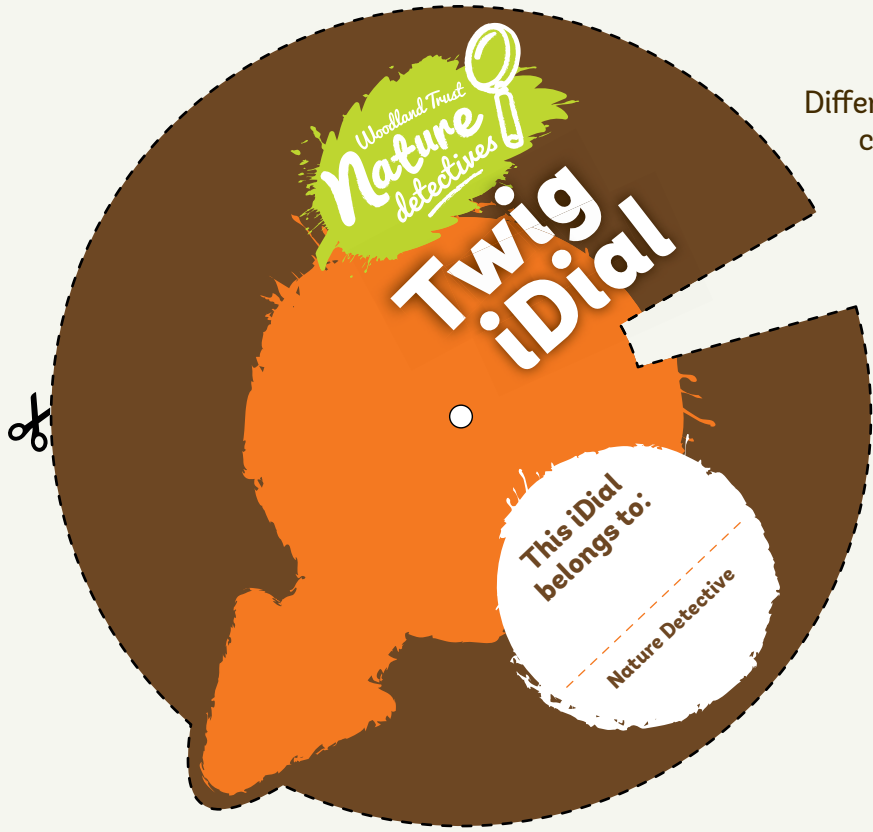
# Twig iDial

## Top piece

### Top tips for top spotters!

Look carefully for leaf buds - they'll give you a big clue as to which tree the twig has come from.

Different twigs are different colours - some are grey, others are brown - and even purple!



### Fab facts!

Hazel is so bendy in spring that it can be tied in a knot without breaking!  
Young rowan twigs start hairy and become smooth later - their buds are hairy all over!
